

What is an Inner Ocean?

The ancient Chinese recognized that even though we draw vital energy from many sources in our lives, we store it in a central channel held deeply within each of our bodies. This pool, often referred to as a sea or ocean in classical medical texts, is a reservoir of energy for the body, mind, and spirit to draw from throughout our entire lives. When our Inner Oceans are abundant and full of life, we also feel this



way and find it easy to be open-hearted, to share our resources, to feel connected to others and this planet, and to cultivate resilience in difficult times.

The opposite is true when we have taxed this life-giving resource: We may feel exhausted, careful to extend ourselves, and sometimes downright hopeless. When our Inner Oceans are depleted, we may not even have the energy for the simplest of tasks or responsibilities, because it puts our nervous system into a state of survival mode. This is where violence, addiction, and the cycle of trauma begins: in the powerlessness that a lack of resources fuels.

Making a Global Difference

The Mothers In Nepal

The Mothers of Sindupalchok, Nepal who are now trained in wilderness first aid and CPR thanks to you, serve villages with a population of 3,000 adults and about 600 children.

In 2020 we were able to once again restock the Mothers personal medical kits and the health posts of all sight, remote Sindupalabels villages with vital medical sight.

Our Nepali crew on the ground has been busy distributing supplies throughout the villages, constantly pivoting with COVID travel restrictions and ever changing road conditions.



This year we hosted the second wilderness first responder and CPR refresher course for all the Mothers and we introduced COVID safety protocols. We outfitted all adults and approximately 600 school-age children with cloth masks, face shields, and hand sanitizer and taught them about COVID safety, i.e. importance of handwashing, social distancing, and not touching their faces.

We also created a new system for tracking medical supplies so that we can receive detailed lists from each Mother of which supplies are most frequently being used, and we can replenish what is most needed on a quarterly basis.



We were also able to purchase and donate 2 oxygen concentrators to the hospice center after hearing of the significant shortage of respiratory equipment as residents were transitioning.

To make access more complicated, Sindupalchok had major flooding and landslides in July that took out 2 entire villages and destroyed many others that we had been working in these last 5+ years. The villages of Bugam and Sothang were hit hardest. Another devastating landslide followed, — hitting the village opposite the valley from Gati in September.

Following the landslides and floods in July, thanks to you and your commitment to our world, we raised a total of \$11,660 to be used strictly for Nepal.

Trauma Training Modules

We are so grateful to receive another grant from the Dr. Scholl Foundation that is earmarked for completion and distribution of the free Trauma Training videos.

With the grant received this year, we plan to engage in significant outreach so we can grow our network and keep trauma



prevention at the forefront of global concerns. Since this training is free, it is a great opportunity for IOEP to grow visibility in the global community and medical service and volunteerism sector.


In 2020; we had several new organizations subscribe to view our Trauma Training Modules including a refugee center in Egypt and a university in Bangkok. Together these organizations serve more than 5,175 individuals.

This has happened with little to no outreach.

Imagine what we can do now with funds dedicated solely to extend this free training to leaders and organizations who work with communities in need!

Colorado Gives Day

Colorado Gives Day is an annual statewide movement to celebrate and increase philanthropy in Colorado through online giving.

This was Inner Ocean's first year participating in Colorado Gives Day and thanks to our generous donors, we were able to **TRIPLE** our donations, totaling \$15,000 on December 8th.





Making a Difference In Our Hometown

Due to the cancellation of our planned projects and trainings in 2020, Inner Ocean had a fundraising surplus from 2019 and we saw an opportunity in our local Boulder County community.

We branched out to create two local "disaster relief" programs:

Pay What You Can Acupuncture & Massage and Healing Our Heroes.

Pay What You Can Acupuncture & Massage

In April 2020, we began planning for the launch of a new program in Boulder County called the **Pay What You Can Acupuncture & Massage Program**. This program enabled community members who have been significantly impacted by COVID to come in and receive treatment at our healing center at an affordable rate.

The PWYCAM program launched in June 2020 and we were interviewed by and featured in the *Daily Camera*, a local paper.

Our starting budget for the program anticipated providing 2, one-hour trauma-informed services to approximately 80 people.





Over the course of 4 months, we have had 51 applicants, and were able to serve 27 people total, who all identified as significantly impacted by COVID, and serve them with 54 hours of specialized care.

Healing Our Heroes

In July, we began planning and budgeting for the launch of our second new program in Boulder County, the **Healing Our Heroes Program**. This Program will enable front line workers in our community to receive two free one-hour trauma-informed services in our clinic.



Bodywork for Liberation massage therapists joined forces with the acupuncturists and herbalists of the Inner Ocean Center for Healing to serve those in the Boulder County community who have been serving and protecting us since the beginning of the pandemic.

We wanted to show our love to all of our front line workers and caregivers through the COVID crisis by inviting them to take a pause at our healing center, let go of stress, and deeply nourish

> themselves so they can return to work refreshed and energized.


